



Artback NT presents: Eastern Arrernte Band NT Regional Tour, Reggae Dancer Ali Curing | Tennant Creek | Gunbalanya | Jabiru | Darwin | Beswick | Numbulwar | Alice Springs

Eastern Arrernte Band are a young desert reggae band emerging from the community of Ltyentye Apurte/Santa Teresa, 80 km from Alice Springs.

Northern Territory Touring agency, Artback NT's Performing Arts Manager, Evan Saunders is "really excited to take Eastern Arrente Band on this epic tour of communities and remote festivals of the Northern Territory in September".

Saunders is particularly passionate about heading 'out bush', to bring live acts to remote communities. "As the only touring agency of our kind in the NT, we know a tour like this comes with big logistical challenges, but the reward is huge. Communities are exposed to new and exciting artists, and from the artists' perspective, the opportunities to perform to crowds of people in hard-to-reach places, travel and play music every day, is an awesome opportunity for many musos."

The packed itinerary sees the band perform as part of Stone Country Festival in the West Arnhem community of Gunbalanya, and the remote coastal community event, the Numburindi Festival in Numbulwar, in the Gulf of Carpentaria.

Made up of Wesley Oliver and Tyrone Hayes who are both on keys & vocals; Barney Conway on drums; Vivian Ryder on lead guitar; Brandon Hayes on rhythm guitar and Baxter Alice on bass, **Eastern Arrente Band** have been playing together since high school. Anyone familiar with the unique desert reggae sound will know how fun it is. With deep vocals and great riffs combined with a classic double keyboard reggae vibe, Eastern Arrente Band bring their own energy to it. "These guys are known to get people up and dancing", says Saunders.

The band will head out and up the highway in early September for their first gig in Ali Curung, followed by Tennant Creek, Gunbalanya, Darwin, Jabiru, Beswick and Numbulwar, where they join a stellar line up of performers such as Ngulmiya Nundhirribala of the Red Flag Dancers, Emily Wurramara, and Salt Water Band from Elcho Island, among others.

As much as the band is looking forward to spreading their sweet desert reggae sound across the bush, they are really looking forward to playing to a Darwin crowd on Tuesday 19 September at Bustard Town, a popular live-music venue in Darwin's CBD. "It's guaranteed to be a big night", says Evan Saunders, "so keen music fans might want to get their tickets in advance".

On Country, the band members (aged from 25-35) work as youth workers, assistant teachers, school bus drivers and night patrol men. By contributing their skills to their land and community, they are inspired to create their unique brand of music. Singing in both English and eastern Arrente, their songs revolve around place and country with a strong sense of self and personal identity. Their lyrics tackle loneliness, incarceration, and issues pertaining to youth and their experiences as young people living on country.
