Following in the footsteps of Maningrida greats like 'Letter Stick Band', **Ripple Effect Band** are forging their own path as the first all-female saltwater rock band from their community to not only pick up instruments but to also blaze both bush touring circuits and national stages. This southern tour features a jam-packed itinerary of the band performing as part of Giiyong Festival on stunning Yuin Country and at live music venues across New South Wales, Canberra and Victoria. They kick off their three-week tour in Sydney on Gadigal country and end their epic journey in Geelong, on Wadawurrung country.

Producing this tour is Northern Territory Touring multi-arts touring agency, Artback NT whose Performing Arts Manager, Evan Saunders is excited about the tour as it will be a massive platform for a remote NT act like Ripple Effect Band to further propel them into the wider Australian Music Scene. "This tour is extra special for many reasons, **Ripple Effect Band** will be playing to some new venues and audiences who've yet to experience their infectious energy, as well as returning to some of their favourite venues in Sydney, Castlemaine and Melbourne."

This is the first interstate tour Artback NT have produced for the band and the first tour partnership with Bush Music Fund who have extended presenting partnerships with Victorian government funded organisation Always Live. Artback NT is also supporting PR and marketing development for the band through creative agencies Thinking Loud and The Annex.

Ripple Effect Band is made up of Tara Rostron, Rachel Thomas, Rona Lawrence, Jolene Lawrence, Jodie Kell, Patricia Gibson, Harriet Fraser-Barbour, Stephanie James and Annastasia Lucia. All band members are skilled artists, who effortlessly shift between different instruments and vocal duties, as well as producing, managing and song writing together and individually. They sing in the languages of their people: Ndjébbana, Burarra, Na-kara and Kune. They have many stories to tell about their land, their languages and their culture, garnering widespread acclaim for their work following their own interstate gigs, music industry nominations and awards and beautifully designed artwork made by close friends and family of the collective.

"You don't need to understand either the Aboriginal Australian language Kune or English to feel the emotion of the song."
